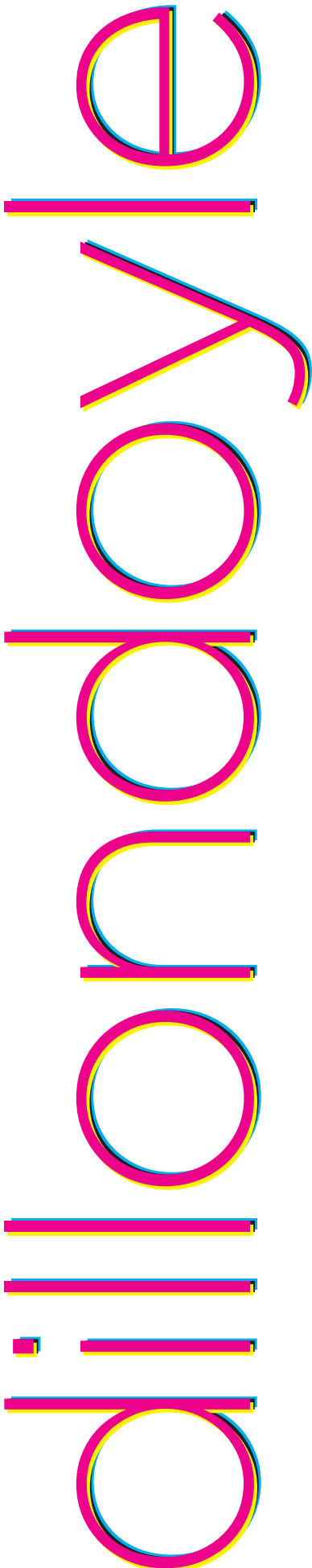

As a founding member and student leader of Students for Barack Obama (SFBO) on the University of Denver (DU) campus, Dillon Doyle worked tirelessly throughout the summer and fall months, coordinating campaign efforts and mobilizing student activists campus-wide. As the Youth Vote Field Organizer for Barack Obama's Campaign for Change in Denver County, Colorado, I had the distinct privilege of working closely with Dillon on the DU campus from September to November, and I am proud to have this opportunity to write on his behalf.

During his tenure as student leader of SFBO at DU, Dillon was responsible for managing the group's day-to-day activities. Initially, this entailed recruiting a volunteer base and establishing a team structure of student leaders and student volunteers. Once the team had been established (with several student leaders and over eighty volunteers), Dillon began coordinating voter registration and voter education activities, organizing and publicizing campaign-related events on campus, and eventually encouraging student participating in 'Early Vote' activities (in the State of Colorado, it is possible to cast votes prior to election day, either by mail or during a stipulated 'Early Vote' period).

While working with Dillon, I was most impressed by his high level of professionalism and dedication to the task at hand. Despite his extensive list extracurricular involvements, student board and committee memberships, and responsibilities as a residential advisor, Dillon remained very committed to his role as a student organizer. The final months of a presidential campaign are an incredibly stressful time, and Dillon excelled under the pressure—despite short notice and last minute changes, Dillon remained flexible, organized, and always an effective manager, delegating responsibilities as needed to other student leaders and volunteers. A true renaissance man, Dillon's resourcefulness was indispensable. He was able to rig PA systems for speakers and events, patch television broadcasts into auditoriums for presidential debate watch parties, create professional posters and promotional materials, and make use of the internet to tap into the extensive existing social networks on campus.

Dillon is the ultimate student organizer—capable of working behind the scenes, but also a charismatic leader who knows how to energize and motivate his fellow students. Making use of his extensive connections with school administrators, faculty, and other student groups, Dillon was adept at building relationships and taking advantage of all available resources. His charisma, combined with his unwavering dedication to the goal of student mobilization, made him an effective and organized campus leader. I am thankful to have had the opportunity to work with Dillon, and I am confident that he will continue to excel in whatever path he chooses, student organizing or otherwise.
